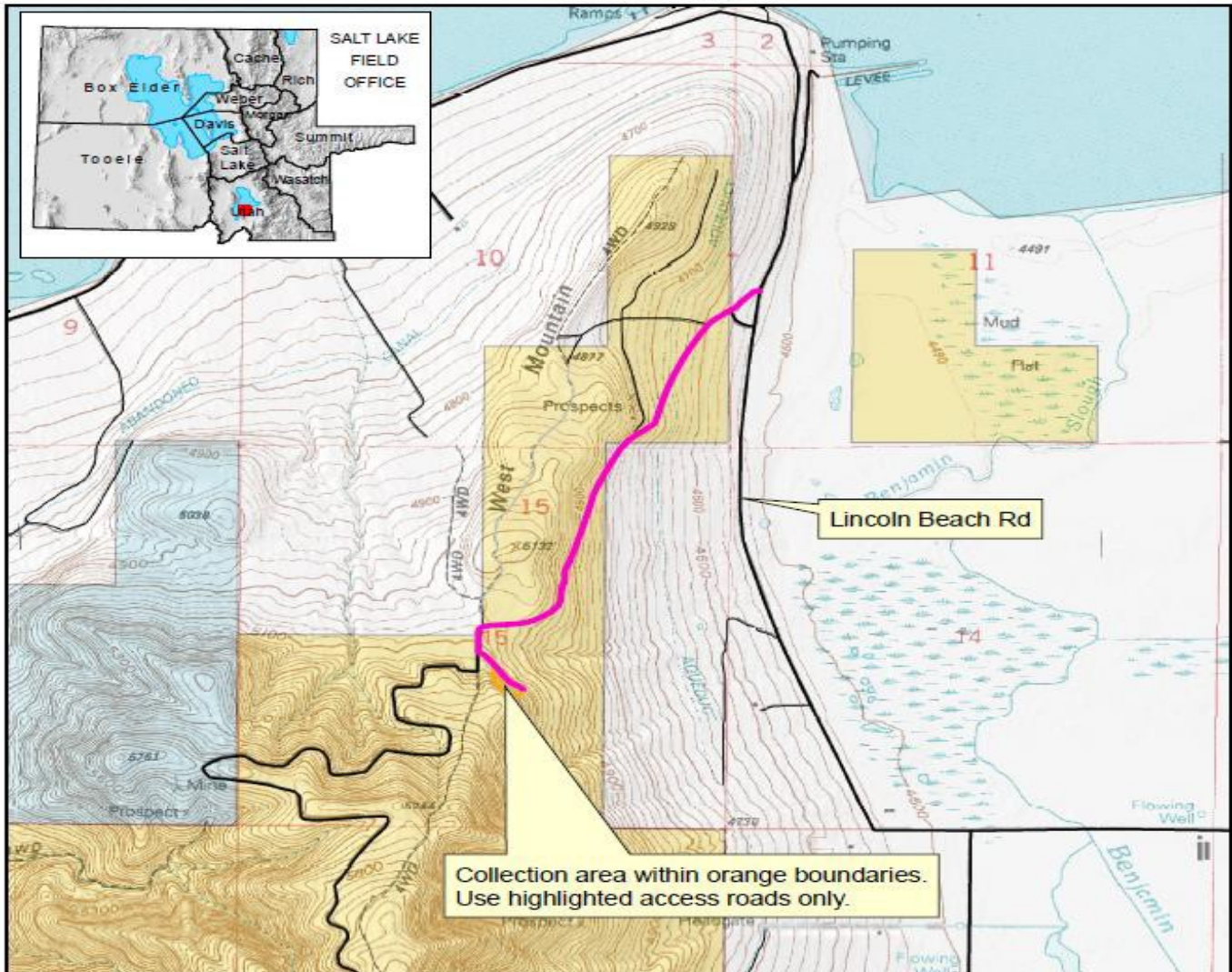

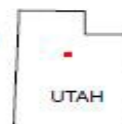

**Geology**

The boulders and cobbles are found as an accumulation of rocks known as a talus slope (cliff base) that were deposited due to rock fall (Scree) from the Pennsylvanian Period 298,900,000-323,200,000 years ago.

Scree slopes are unstable, difficult to climb, and potentially dangerous .

These angular rocks are typically 2-3" to 2-3' in size and range in color from tan to brown.

**RULES**

**A permit is required.**

- No material may be excavated, processed, or removed unless it is located within the designated community pit area.
- Rock removal by hand tools only!
- No more than \$2000 of material is allowed for purchase at a time.
- If the purchaser violates any provisions of the permit, an authorized officer may, by written notice, suspend any future operations of the purchaser.
- Adhere to state and federal rules, including weight restrictions and speed regulations.
- Stay on pre-existing roads.



**ACCESS**

Recommended high-clearance and 4-wheel drive vehicles. Roads are rocky and can be muddy. Trailer-accessible with room to maneuver and camp if desired.
